the ninety five theses were written by martin luther in 1517 and are widely regarded as the initial catalyst for the protestant reformation the disputation protests against clerical abuses especially the sale of indulgences the background to luther s ninety five theses centers on practices within the catholic church regarding baptism and absolution significantly the theses reject the validity of indulgences remissions of temporal punishment due for sins which have already been forgiven they also view with great cynicism the practice of indulgences being sold and thus the penance for sin representing a financial transaction rather than genuine contrition luther argues that the

sale of indulgences was a gross violation of the original intention of confession and penance and that christians were being falsely told that they could find absolution through the purchase of indulgences luther objected to a saying attributed to johann tetzel that as soon as the coin in the coffer rings the soul from purgatory springs he insisted that since forgiveness was god s alone to grant those who claimed that indulgences absolved buyers from all punishments and granted them salvation were in error christians he said must not slacken in following christ on account of such false assurances

The ninety-five theses or disputation on the power of indulgences are a list of propositions for an academic disputation written in 1517 by Martin Luther, professor of moral theology at the University of Wittenberg, Germany, that started the Reformation, a schism in the Catholic Church which profoundly changed Europe. They advance Luther's positions against what he saw as the abuse of the practice of clergy selling plenary indulgences, which were certificates believed to reduce the temporal punishment for sins committed by the purchasers or their loved ones in purgatory. In the theses, Luther claimed that the repentance required by Christ in order for sins to be forgiven involves inner spiritual repentance rather than merely external sacramental confession. He argued that indulgences led Christians to avoid true repentance and sorrow for sin, believing that they could forgo it by purchasing an indulgence.

Ask any Christian and he or she will agree that Luther's 95 theses lit the match that became a worldwide fire, yet almost none have actually read the theses. This short book gives all 95 theses in list form, a chapter on what each thesis said with a critical analysis, plus an afterword about their impact on the world. In short, at the time he wrote the theses, he merely wanted fellow academics to join a discussion; he had no intention of lighting a fire that rocked the medieval world. See for yourself what the 95 theses really were. You might be very surprised. The author has reduced the number of theses to about 15, whereas the original German version reduced them to 20. You will see why.

The sixteenth-century document that changed the course of Christianity, monk and theology professor Martin Luther found himself in disagreement with the Roman Catholic Church on the subject of indulgences, certificates sold by the church that promised to spare their owners from punishment for their sins. With his 95 theses, Luther proposed a debate on the subject, but ultimately he was excommunicated and the Protestant Reformation began. This is both a religious document and a historical one, a turning point that marked a challenge to papal authority, set off political conflicts and bloody war in Europe, and led to the remarkable variety of Christian denominations and sects that exist in the world today.

Martin Luther, professor of moral theology at the University of Wittenberg and town preacher, wrote the ninety-five theses against the contemporary practice of the church with respect to indulgences in the Catholic Church, practically the only Christian church in Western Europe at the time. Indulgences are part of the economy of salvation.

In 1517, Martin Luther's 95 theses sparked what became known as the Reformation, a movement that changed the church forever. However, many who have read the 95 theses often find it cryptic or dated. Martin Luther, the leader of the Protestant Reformation, was born at Eisleben, Prussian Saxony, on November 10, 1483. He studied jurisprudence at the University of Erfurt, where he later lectured on physics and ethics. In 1505, he entered the Augustinian monastery at Erfurt, two years later was ordained priest, and in 1508 became professor of philosophy at the University of Wittenberg. The starting point of Luther's career as a reformer was his posting on the church door of Wittenberg the ninety-five theses on October 31, 1517. These formed a passionate statement of the true nature of penitence and a protest against the sale of indulgences. In issuing the theses, Luther expected the support of his ecclesiastical superiors, and it was only after three years of controversy during which he refused a summons to Rome that he proceeded to publish those works that brought about his expulsion from the church.

By almost any reckoning, the ninety-five theses ranks as the most important text of the Reformation, if not in substance, at least in impact. As the anniversary of its posting on the church door in Wittenberg approaches, what better way to remember and recognize the occasion than to make this important text more easily understood by twenty-first century readers? Timothy J.
